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#### 1. Foreword

The event will run as Timed Road Rally, using the classic lanes of **OS Map 136**. At MC 0 Entrants will be provided plotting references of 6 & 8 figure grid references along with detailed 3 meter control diagrams in order to comply with (R) 9.1 There will be ample time allowed for plotting.

We would like to thank all our supporters, sponsors, residents on the route, MSUK, Local Authorities, Dyfed Powys Police, WAMC, ANWCC, AWMCC, WBCC, RLO, marshals and the numerous other people without whom this event could not take place.

We look forward to seeing both past and new competitors on the event.

#### 2. Announcement

Newtown and District Automobile Club Ltd will organise an Interclub Permit Road Rally, all competitors will require a RS Interclub Motorsport UK competition licence to compete in this event.

#### 3. Jurisdiction

The meeting will be held under the general regulations of the MSUK, (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these supplementary regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.

#### 6. Eligibility

The event is open to all members of the organising club and members of clubs affiliated to either the Welsh Association of Motor Clubs or the Association of North Western Car Clubs. All competitors must produce a valid Motorsport UK Competition Licence and club membership card as appropriate for inspection for Signing On.

#### 7. Entries

The entry list opens on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> November 2023 and will close for seeding on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December 2023 at 2100hrs.

All entries must be made on the official electronic entry form and be accompanied by the appropriate entry fee.

All crews **MUST** supply a marshal, who must be signed on before they will be allowed to start the event. This rule will be strictly enforced. No marshal, no start.

The entry fee is £130 (to include 2 breakfasts).

The maximum entry for the Meeting is 75 and 5 reserves. The minimum is 50. The minimum for each class is 5. Should any of the above minimum figures not be reached the organisers have the right to either cancel the event or amalgamate classes as necessary.

All entries received via the online entry system will receive an automated acknowledgement; this is not confirmation of entry.

Entries will only be accepted when full payment has been received. When we have received payment, you should receive an e-mail confirming your entry.

Entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis, providing the entry form is complete.

The organisers reserve the right to retain 5 places for allocation at their discretion H29.1.3(a). Any entry containing a false or incorrect statement shall be null and void, and the entrant deemed to be guilty of a breach of the general Competition Rules of Motorsport UK. The entry fee may be forfeited in accordance with D19.

The organisers may conduct random checks to establish the validity of all or some of the information contained on the entry form. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without giving their reasons.

#### 8. Under 18 Driver/Co-Driver

Parents, Guardians or Guarantors of drivers or navigator under the age of 18 years of age are now required to sign on at the start of events to enable their child to participate.

By signing on , those parents, guardians or guarantors have confirmed they have acquainted themselves with, and agree with, and agree to be bound by the MotorsportUK's General regulations and MotorsportUK's regulation D13.1.1.(c).

They also agree to accept the consequences and any associated penalties imposed for not adhering to Regulations to General regulations.

For the MotorsportUK's Regulations please refer to the MotorsportUK's Year Book. Motorsport UK Regulation D13.1.1. (C)

If I am the Parent or Guardian of the driver 'I understand that I shall have the right to be present during any procedure being carried out under the Supplementary Regulations issued for this event and the General Regulations of the MotorsportUK's.'

As the Parent/ Guardian 'I confirm that I have acquainted myself and the minor with the MotorsportUK's General Regulations, agree to pay any appropriate charges and fees pursuant to those Regulations (to include any appendices thereto) and hereby agree to be bound by those Regulations and submit myself without reserve to the consequences resulting from those Regulations (and any subsequent alteration therefore).

Further, I agree to pay as liquidated damages any fines imposed upon me up to the maxima set out in Part 3, Appendix 1'.

Where the parent is not present there must be a guardian who must produce a written and signed authorisation from the Parent/Guardian to act as their representative.

A Parental Consent Authorisation form is available to download from the MotorsportUK's website, www.motorsportuk.org, in the forms section.

#### 9. Classes

**CLASS 1 - Masters** Either member of the crew having won a National B / RS Inter Club Restricted or higher status event in the last 5 years.

**CLASS 2 - Experts** Either member of the crew having finished in the top 10 of a National B / RS Inter Club in the last 5 years.

CLASS 3 - Semi Experts All crews not eligible for the other classes.

**CLASS 4 - Novices** Neither member of the crew having won an award on a road event, excluding 12 cars.

#### Note:

- a) Competitors eligible for two or more classes must enter the higher class
- b) Competitors who have not won an overall or class award since 1st July 2013, may if they so wish, enter the next class down to which they would otherwise be eligible.
- c) Crews may be re-classified at the discretion of the organisers.
- d) Entries accepted without any seeding information will run at the rear of the class entered.
- e) No discussion will be entered into regarding seeding.

#### 10. Start-Finish

The event will cover around 100 mile on metaled roads, **there will be petrol** along the route or at the finish. OS Map number 136 (1:50,000) latest edition will be required. Breakfast will be provided for crew members.

#### 11. Scrutineering

Location - See table below

All vehicles must comply with the current MSUK Technical Regulations J and R18 in addition to having a valid road fund licence, MOT and the driver must have valid insurance for use on the public highway.

Additionally, all competitors should comply with the following:

- (i) Red reflective warning triangles MUST be carried.
- (ii) Maximum noise levels as per R18.3.3. The specific method of noise test, be it the 0.5m or 2.0m test, will be determined by the environmental scrutineer at the start of testing dependent upon the location and prevailing conditions and will be the same for all competitors.
- (iii) All seats must be securely mounted, with front seats having an effective lock mechanism to prevent them from tipping forward and with backrest movement securely restrained. Spare wheels, tools, batteries, etc
- (iv) Competitors are strongly recommended to carry a first aid kit.
- (v) Tyres must comply with Construction & Use Regulations and MUST have a MINIMUM of 1.6mm tread depth.
- (vi) No external navigation/marshal lights.
- (vii) Reversing lights must comply with Road Traffic Acts.
- (viii) Adverts on vehicles limited to event sponsors decals and rally plates as supplied by the organisers.
- (ix) Intercoms and radio transmitters (CB etc) are not allowed. Mobile phones may be carried, but only used in an emergency and in compliance with the relevant RTA (GR R7.2.3)
- (x) Spare fuel may only be carried in competing vehicles if carried in an appropriate container (1 in number only) and if securely fastened
- (xi) Bodywork shall comply with GR R18 (xii) All competitors are requested to carry a spill kit.
- (xii) An SOS/OK board must be carried.
- (xiii) Spot lights are permitted

#### 12. Insurance

The Organisers have applied to Bluefin Sport for a Blanket Cover Note under the above scheme. This will provide competitors who need to use the scheme with the Third Party Cover necessary to meet RTA requirements on the Road Sections of the event.

The basic rate for the event before any loadings will be £29.00 including insurance premium tax at 12%.

All applicants wishing to use the scheme must be able to comply with all points of the Bluefin Sport Declaration: -

- I do not have the Third Party Road Section extension on my current Motor Insurance.
- I am aged 19 or over.

- I have had no more than 1 fault claim in the last three years
- I have no more than a maximum of 6 conviction points or a licence ban on my UK driving licence
- I have the appropriate competition licence as well as a UK/EU driving license and if my license is provisional I will be supervised by an adult over 25.
- I have no physical or mental disabilities
- My vehicle is MOT'd, Taxed and Insured for the road
- I have no other material facts to disclose
- Anyone aged less than 19 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their co-driver be a more senior member of their family or over 25.

If you comply with all points above no Letter of Acceptance will be required. If unable to comply with any of the above points you will be required to complete the Declaration form (the form can be obtained by contacting the event secretary or Bluefin Sport) which should be forwarded either to the organisers or direct to Bluefin Sport prior to the event to allow sufficient time for a letter of acceptance to be issued.

The driver declaration form is available at the same location as these supplementary regulations. The fully completed driver declaration form is to be returned to the Entries secretary, no less than 7 days prior to the event. If a competitor arranges his or her own Third Party Cover, they will be required to supply the policy number and the name and address of his or her own insurers on the entry form. A competitor wishing to arrange his or her own Third Party Cover should ensure that the cover does not exclude his or her competing on a rally, at signing on in accordance with R5.1 and sign a disclaimer. Any competitor failing to provide proof of adequate insurance cover for the event will not be permitted to start and will not be refunded their entry fee.

#### 13. Timing

The event will use the scheduled timing method. Timing will be to BST (BBC Time) and by marshals' digital clocks. All crews are advised to carry an accurate digital watch with them.

**NEUTRAL SECTIONS** These are deemed **QUIET** sections and are used to take the rally through PR sensitive or densely populated areas, and will not be timed to an accuracy of less than one minute. **PLEASE RESPECT THEM**. They are timed at a low average speed and competitors must complete the section in as high a gear as possible and without use of auxiliary lights (except as permitted by law when driving in fog or falling snow). Competitors **MUST NOT** make up time in these sections, and no penalty will be incurred for lateness other than for exceeding maximum lateness.

Any lateness incurred in these sections will be cumulative towards Maximum Lateness. Maximum permitted lateness for this event will be 30min and 59seconds for all classes. R12.6.1 (3/4 rule) may NOT be applied on Neutral Sections Timing at time controls will be when the Time Control card or Passage Control card is presented to the marshal and NOT the time of entering the control area, as per R12.3.

**STANDARD SECTIONS** This is a section where a time penalty will be applied for being early or late. Some Standard Sections will be timed to an accuracy of less than one minute R12.8. Timing at the controls will be when the vehicle reaches the marshal, however not person to person contact will occur.

A competitor who wishes to may miss a control or controls. They will be penalised in accordance with R13 for every control missed.

If they re-joins the route at a control at the end of a competitive section they will be permitted to restart without further penalty at any time between his original scheduled time and his maximum permitted lateness, this maximum permitted lateness time still being in relation to there original scheduled time.

If the re-joining control is at the end of a neutral section, they will only be permitted to restart without further penalty at there official corrected time taken at the last control at which they reported within maximum lateness.

Competitors late at one control may be the equivalent amount late at succeeding controls without further penalty provided maximum lateness is not exceeded. Where a control at the end of a section timed to the second also forms the start of a section timed to the minute, the departure will be taken as the time of arrival but to the preceding whole minute (i.e. the seconds will be ignored) this will be in accordance with R12.5.2.

#### 14. Driving Standards Observers and Judges of Fact

The organisers in accordance with R8.1, may appoint DSO's or Judges of Fact. Checks manned by these officials will be identified by control boards with either DSO or Judge of Fact displayed on them only. Failure to stop when requested by a DSO or Judge of Fact will incur the penalty of EXCLUSION. A full list of DSO's, Judges of fact and the facts to be judged will be displayed at documentation.

#### 15. Results

Assessment of performance will be decided firstly by the number of fails, then time penalties accumulated.

Ties will be decided in favour of the furthest cleanest, then, if still not resolved, in favour of the least number of driven wheels, and then in favour of the smallest engine capacity, as per R15.2.2.

The organisers reserve the right to cancel sections from the results should they deem it fairer to do so, "Force Majeure" etc. notwithstanding.

Time Controls at which, in the organiser's opinion, inaccurate times may have been given to competitors shall be considered as either Passage Controls or Route Checks. Provisional results will be produced as soon as possible after the event in accordance with H35.1.1 – H35.1.8.

Competitors will be supplied with one Results Query Form. More than one query on the same matter must be treated as Protests. Protests must be made in accordance with C5.1 – C5.7 and accompanied by the appropriate fee (appendix 1 Section 13).

#### 16. Damage Declaration

Competitors will be required to complete and sign a report declaring that they have not been involved in any incident resulting in damage to private property or injury to persons or animals, or alternatively give details of any such incident.

Any information given will incur no penalty, but a competitor failing to provide a completed form at the finish or within 48 hrs for non-finishers, or falsifying a declaration will be excluded retrospectively from the results, forfeit any award gained and reported to MotorsportUK.

Where an accident has occurred the organisers must be notified on the day of the event. Competitors who retire shall be required to submit the form within 48 hrs to the Entries Secretary giving the location and reason for retirement.

Any competitor, who, as a result of his driving on the event, is prosecuted by the police, will be excluded retrospectively from the results and forfeit any award gained as per D25.1.15, H37.1.1 and R8.4. Competitors are reminded that by law they should report any incidents to the police.

#### **17. Awards**

Awards will be presented as follows:

First overall

First in each class (if more than 5 in class)

Second in each class (if more than 7 in class)

Third in each class (if more than 10 in class)

Highest placed Mixed / All Female Crew.

Highest placed NADAC crew (the competing car must contain both driver and navigator registered as a member of the club prior to the start of the event)

A crew may only win one award (1 trophy for driver and 1 trophy for navigator).

Provisional results will be announced at the finish as soon as possible after each event and will become final after 30 minutes subject to the resolution of protests, which must be made in accordance with the provisions of C.5.

#### 18. Pacenotes

The use of pace notes or map markings is forbidden.

Navigation on the event must only be carried out by the use of competitors own Ordnance Survey Map No. 136/137 (1:50 000 Series) only as per R9.1.5. Any other form of navigation will be classed as pace notes. Pace notes will be defined as any marking(s) on the map not provided by the organisers as per R9.1.6. Any competitor found in possession of such map markings / pace notes will be EXCLUDED. There will be random map checks carried out throughout the course of the event by Judges of Fact. ANY COMPETITOR (S) REPEATEDLY OBSERVED ON THE ROUTE PRACTISING PRIOR TO THE EVENT MAY NOT BE PERMITTED TO START AT THE ORGANISERS' DISCRETION.

#### 19. Service & Spot Lights

Service will not be permitted at any time during the duration of the event, except by the crew working on their own car; this also applies at any halt. The penalty for infringement will be EXCLUSION (R7.2.4). However, competitors may work unaided, and may borrow tools from the proprietor of a halt, or borrow from fellow competitors only - NOT from spectators and the general public. Spot lights CAN be used.

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


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
